Wildernesse Residents' Association Treasurer's Report for the year ended 31 December 2019

Membership for 2019 was 112 households, a rise from 104 in 2018. The number of full members, excluding associates and friends, rose to 107 from 101. This is our highest number for some years.

Total income from membership subscriptions was £10,910. Our only other income was a very small amount of bank interest.

Our costs in 2019 were much higher than usual at £16,444, almost entirely due to legal and professional fees. These totalled £15,693 compared with the unusually low amount of £300 the previous year. In part, this reflected timing matters. Our report on last year's accounts had forecast that legal costs would be substantially higher this year, partly because of a looming and significant covenants issue. This issue only reached the point of requiring professional advice in 2019. Advice included opinions from a specialist QC as well as professional examination of boundaries. Following this input, we reached a mutual understanding with the owners of the property concerned and we believe there is no imminent threat to the covenants.

Administration expenses of £750 primarily covered the AGM and professional liability insurance for the committee.

In 2020, the committee is aiming to rebuild WRA finances following the high expenditure in 2019. Events in the year underlined the need to hold a significant reserve to enable us to take appropriate steps against threats arising to the covenants or the environment of the estate. We are not at present aware of any immediate threats, but some potential issues exist and threats can emerge unexpectedly. Legal costs can mount quickly and we must have sufficient funds to obtain appropriate advice and carry out necessary steps to try to resolve issues efficiently and promptly – as we have successfully done in the past. Quick and resolute action is typically the best way of resolving threats to the estate.

We therefore propose that subscriptions for 2020 should remain at the same level as 2019:

Full membership £100 Associate membership £50 Friends £30

Associate membership covers those living in the Stables in Wildernesse Avenue and those who move in future into Wildernesse House. These residents are not covered by the covenants but still do benefit from our efforts to maintain the environment of the Estate. Friends are residents from outside the Estate who are interested in and supportive of our activities.
